# Stemming Irregular Migration in Northern and Central Ethiopia

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

- Part of EU Emergency Trust Fund for Africa
- First Delegated agreement signed following <u>Valletta Summit on Migration</u>.
- Valletta Action Plan: Priority domains 1 "Development benefits of migration and addressing root causes of irregular migration and forced displacement – Investing in development and poverty eradication"
- Total budget: 20 million Euros
- Implementation period: Dec 2015/2017 inception phase Dec 2017 Dec 2019
- Implemented by: Embassy of Italy in Addis Ababa, sided by the Italian Agency for Development Cooperation (AICS)







#### SINCE OBJECTIVES

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• To contribute to the reduction of **irregular migration** from Northern and Central Ethiopia by **improving the living conditions** of the most vulnerable population, including potential migrants and returnees with specific focus on **youth and women**.

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• To establish inclusive economic programs that **create employment opportunities** for potential migrants, returnees and refugees, especially women and youths, in the **most migration prone regions** of Ethiopia (Addis Ababa, Amhara, Oromia, SNNPR and Tigray) by strengthening the capacities of local **vocational training** providers (TVET) and promoting **public private partnerships** (PPPs) in strategic economic clusters.

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• Improved access of beneficiaries to TVET and employments opportunities through the promotion of partnerships among TVET service providers and the private sector.

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• Improved capacity of selected industrial clusters to create additional job opportunities with a special focus on the **promotion of decent work**.

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
• Enhanced capacity of local Public Employment Services (PES) to provide effective employment services.







#### LOGIC of INTERVENTION



## PILOT INTERVENTION


- Under the aegis of the SINCE Programme, ILO is implementing the project on "Addressing the Root causes of migration in Ethiopia".
- The overall **objective** of the project is to contribute to reduction of irregular migration by generating decent livelihood and employment opportunities locally for the youth especially women, hence enabling them to take informed decisions about migration.
- The project has **two specific outcomes** :
  - Dutcome 1- Increased evidence on migration, employment and decent livelihood opportunities in selected woredas that will inform SINCE project design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation
    Dutcome 2- Enhance smooth school to work transition for university and TVET female and male
  - graduates
- The **target beneficiaries -** unemployed youth, University & TVET graduates, potential & returnee migrants.





#### **Selected Beneficiaries to September 30**










## September 2018 KEY PROGRESS RESULTS

#### **Trainees in Quarter 3**






Out of the total 8200 targeted beneficiaries, 1251 (15.25%) are enrolled in training courses across the different targeted value chains.







## September 2018 KEY PROGRESS RESULTS



A total of 10 sectoral platforms have been held reaching 67 % of the indicator target as 15 are planned to be achieved by the end of the Programme implementation. These sectoral platforms are relevant fora where Sector Concerned Government Authorities, SMEs and TVETs gather to address needs to improve their specific sector development. It also represents an important platform to link employment and skills needs.







#### GENDER MAINSTREAMING



Beside 1739 women so fare engaged (51.32% of all beneficiaries), Gender Matrix per project is being carried out by UNIDO who has recruited a Gender Expert to support all SINCE Consortia to mainstream Gender inclusion/empowerment across key Programme deliverables and mind set changing mechanisms.







## **CHALLENGES**

- •Engaged TVET Colleges under-equipment. The majority of engaged TVET colleges under SINCE Programme lack of appropriate equipment to carry out effective trainings to the trainees and based to SMEs needs. This entails low quality of training and needs further thinking from the Donor system on possible interventions solutions to increase the capacities of TVETs in delivering high level trainings.
- •Across the different Lots and in particular Lot 1, resistance have been encountered by the Private in committing themselves in Public Private Partnership (PPPs) in relation to wage employment and decent work principles.
- •**Price inflation** of training raw materials mainly in the metal sector has risen drastically compared to the same period in the previous years.
